| Antarctic region | The worlds fifth largest continent found in the Southern Hemisphere. Covered in an ice sheet, it is the coldest, driest, highest and windiest place on Earth. | Greta Thunberg | A 16-year-old climate activist who inspired an international movement of students to take part in demonstrations demanding action against climate change. |
| Arctic region | One of the coldest places on Earth found in the Northern Hemisphere and includes parts of Canada, Alaska, Russia, Finland, Sweden, Norway, Greenland and Iceland; along with the Arctic Ocean. | iceberg | A floating mass of ice that has detached from a glacier. |
| Aurora | Natural displays of coloured lights seen in the skies near North and South Poles. Examples include The Aurora Borealis (Northern Lights) and The Aurora Australis (Southern Lights). | Inuit | Indigenous people who live in the Arctic regions (people who have always lived there). |
| Biome | A large naturally occurring community of flora and fauna occupying a major habitat, e.g. forest or tundra. | Northern hemisphere | The part of the Earth that is north of the Equator. |
| Climate change | Any significant long-term change in the expected patterns of average weather of a region (or the whole Earth) over a significant period of time. | Southern Hemisphere | The part of the Earth that is south of the Equator. |
| Glacier | A large body of ice. | Sustainability | Sustainable living is living in a way in which we can continue to do so in the future, for example, re-planting trees to off-set deforestation. |
